She has studied at IGHR (since 1998), the National Institute on Genealogical Research (NIGR) in Washington, D.C. and the Salt Lake Institute of Genealogy (Salt Lake City, UT) and has been a previous faculty member of IGHR.

Members receive the KCGS newsletter and KCGS Quarterly, *Kansas Review*, as part of their membership.

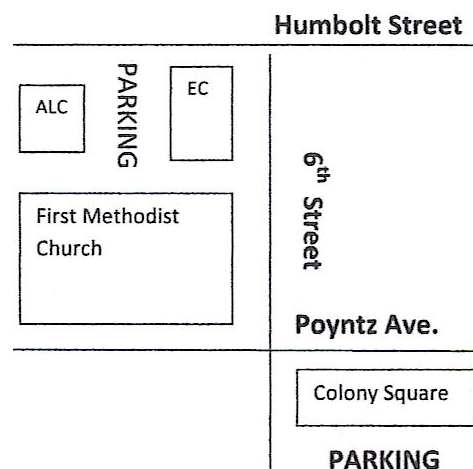
